Module 1 Identification and preliminary study of an energy project National and regional energy master plan, and selection of projects. Economic, financial, technical and legal criteria for selecting projects. Prefeasibility study: selection; funding sources; preparation of terms of reference; recruitment of consultants; monitoring. Environmental and social assessment (ESA) and choices resulting therefrom.	 Module 2 Conducting a feasibility study Definition and sizing of the feasibility study of an energy project. Technical studies, choice of technical solutions. Bankability of energy projects. Specific features of regional projects. Special characteristics of the main donors. Project structuring.
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 Module 3 Environmental and social impact assessment (ESIA) National and international requirements of sustainable development. Phases of the assessment: preliminary scoping, impact assessment methods and tools. Estimate of the project's environmental and social management costs. Stakeholder consultation plans. Management of an impact study. 	Module 4 Project financing and structuring Overview of the main funding sources of energy projects. Practices and requirements of the main donors. Structuring public and PPP projects for operation. Legal characteristics of the various models. Legal documents and acts to be prepared. Project planning until commissioning.
